**ORDER GRANTING TRUSTEE'S MOTION TO ESTABLISH CERTAIN NOTICE,  
CASE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES (Doc. 133)**

THIS CASE came on for consideration before this Court on the Trustee's Motion to Establish Certain Notice, Case Management and Administrative Procedures (Doc. 133), this Court having reviewed the Motion, the court file, and being otherwise familiar with the papers and pleadings in this case, it is hereby

ORDERED:

1. The Motion is GRANTED.
2. In lieu of compliance with service to all creditors under the circumstances normally required by Rule 2002 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure and Rule 2002-1 of the Local Rules of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Florida, the Trustee is authorized to establish a website at [www.shumaker.com/beyond-band-of-brothers-bankruptcy](http://www.shumaker.com/beyond-band-of-brothers-bankruptcy) for creditors and other parties in interest to access and download, without charge,

significant filings in the main bankruptcy case and related adversary proceedings which will generally be posted within five business days of their filing. That website will also provide relevant links to the Court's website for purposes of preparing and filing proofs of claim. Finally, the website will alert creditors and other parties in interest to upcoming deadlines potentially applicable to them. A postcard will be served by United States Mail on all scheduled creditors and parties in interest and creditors who have filed proofs of claim alerting them of the same as well as their right to "opt-out" of the website noticing and request delivery of notices and court filings by United States Mail by emailing [BGasaway@Shumaker.com](mailto:BGasaway@Shumaker.com).

3. This Court specifically finds that such alternative website noticing is fair and reasonable under the circumstances; it balances the cost of mailings to thousands of creditors against the goal of preserving the Estate's assets for the benefit of creditors and is in fact designed to provide good and adequate notice under the circumstances.

4. Following the mail out of the postcard, notifying creditors and other parties in interest of this alternative noticing through the above website, the Trustee is authorized to limit service of motions, notices and other filings to: (i) those parties requesting notice electronically pursuant to CM/ECF registration, (ii) the United States Trustee, (iii) the Chapter 7 Trustee, (iv) those creditors and other parties in interest directly affected by the filing and (v) any creditors and other parties in interest who "opt-out" of the website noticing and request delivery of notices and court filings by United States Mail.

Attorney Steven M. Berman is directed to serve a copy of this Order on interested parties who are non-CM/ECF users and file a proof of service within 3 days of entry of the Order.
