Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) Awards More than \$400K in Grants for Lake Erie Projects: ODNR has approved more than \$437,000 in funding through the Coastal Management Assistance Grant (CMAG) program for five projects in Toledo, Eastlake, Ashtabula County, Lorain, and Bay Village that will improve coastal planning, public access, and water quality. This year's projects include installing ADA-accessible parking spaces and walkways, implementing green stormwater infrastructure, and enhancing stream and wetland habitats which will help filter and improve water quality, and developing plans and engineering designs needed to improve public access and restore coastal habitat. #### Recalls

**July 29, 2019:** Premium Foods USA, Inc., a Woodside, New York establishment and importer of record, is recalling approximately 76,025 pounds of various Siluriformes fish products that were not presented for import re-inspection into the United States. Additionally, the products were imported from Bangladesh and Myanmar, countries ineligible to export Siluriformes fish product to the United States. Additional information is available here.

**July 29, 2019:** JuJu Bakes, LLC, DBA The Cookie Dough Cafe of Bloomington, Illinois is recalling 15 cases of 1.6 ounce Chocolate Chip Chilled Gourmet Edible Cookie Dough Bars, because they may contain peanuts. People who have an allergy or severe sensitivity to peanuts run the risk of serious or life-threatening allergic reaction if they consume these products. Additional information is available here.

**July 29, 2019:** The Lennox Intl Inc. located in Edison, New Jersey, is voluntary recalling its Natural Pig ears because they have the potential to be contaminated with Salmonella. Additional information is available <a href="here">here</a>.

- **July 29, 2019:** Pita Pal Foods, LP of Houston, Texas has issued a voluntary recall of certain hummus products made between May 15, 2019 through July 11, 2019, due to concerns over Listeria monocytogenes, which was identified at the manufacturing facility (not in finished product) during an FDA inspection. - **July 26, 2019:** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), along with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and state and local partners, are investigating a multistate outbreak of Cyclospora illnesses potentially linked to fresh basil exported by Siga Logistics de RL de CV located in Morelos, Mexico. - **July 26, 2019:** Williams Foods LLC has initiated a voluntary and precautionary recall of the following items: Great Value Mild Taco Seasoning Mix, item number 564829444, product UPC 0 78742 24572 0; HEB Taco Seasoning Mix Reduced Sodium item number 050215, Product UPC 0 41220 79609 0. - **July 26, 2019:** Euphoria Fancy Food Inc. of Brooklyn, New York is recalling its 500 gram packages of "Tainy Vostoka Assorted Dry Fruits-Apple" because they contain undeclared sulfites. Consumers who have severe sensitivity to sulfites run the risk of serious or lifethreatening allergic reactions if they consume this product. Additional information is available here.
- **July 25, 2019:** Herbal Doctor Remedies is voluntarily recalling all drug products within expiry to the consumer level. These products have been marketed without FDA approval and were manufactured outside of the controls required by current Good Manufacturing Practices (cGMP). Additional information is available here.
- **July 23, 2019:** Mountain Rose Herbs (MRH) of Eugene, Oregon is recalling all sizes ranging from 4 ounce to 50 pounds of its Fennel Seed Whole, Lot #25031, because they have the potential to be contaminated with Salmonella, an organism which can cause serious and sometimes fatal infections in young children, frail or elderly people, and others with weakened immune systems. - **July 22, 2019:** Elevation Foods is voluntarily recalling containers of Archer Farms-brand egg salad; Freskëtbrand egg salad, tuna salad, and Thai lobster salad; and Archer Farms-brand deviled egg sandwiches produced on June 18, 2019 due to possible contamination with Listeria monocytogenes. Listeria monocytogenes is an organism which can cause serious and sometimes fatal infections in young children, frail or elderly people, and others with weakened immune systems. - July 19, 2019: Mizkan America, Inc., announced the voluntary recall of select production codes of certain RAGÚ® pasta sauces in the U.S. because the sauce may contain fragments of plastic. There have not been any reports of consumer injuries or complaints. Mizkan America is taking this action out of an abundance of caution. This recall is at the retail level and all impacted retailer customers have been notified of this voluntary recall prior to this press release. Additional information is available here.
- July 17, 2019: Northfork Bison Distributions Inc. of St. Leonard, Quebec is recalling its Bison Burgers & Bison Ground because they have the potential to be contaminated with E. coli: O121 and O103. This form of E. coli may cause diarrheal illness often with bloody stools. Although most healthy adults can recover completely within a week, some people can develop a form of kidney failure called Hemolytic Uremic Syndrome (HUS). HUS is most likely to occur in young children and the elderly. The condition can lead to serious damage and even death. - **July 16, 2019:** Wismettac Asian Foods, Inc., Santa Fe Springs, California is issuing a voluntary recall for eight (8) types of Shirakiku brand imported fish cake products because of the possible contamination of some allergens (Milk, egg, and crustacean shellfish). People who have a sensitivity to milk, egg, or shellfish run the risk of serious or life threatening allergic reaction if they consume the product. - **July 16, 2019:** Pita Pal Foods, LP of Houston, Texas has issued a voluntary recall of certain hummus products made between May 30, 2019 and June 25, 2019, due to concerns over Listeria monocytogenes, which was identified at the manufacturing facility (not in finished product) during an FDA inspection. Additional information is available here.
- **July 15, 2019:** DaVinci Laboratories, a division of FoodScience Corporation of Williston, Vermont has contacted FDA and is voluntarily recalling 256 bottles of Omega-3 1000 that may be labeled as Dim Plex. A small number of bottles may contain undeclared fish (anchovy & sardines) allergen. People who have an allergy or severe sensitivity to fish run the risk of serious or life-threatening allergic reaction if they consume these products. - **July 12, 2019:** Baumer Foods, Inc. of Metairie, Louisiana is recalling 10 ounce PICS Soy Sauce, because it may contain undeclared fish. People who have an allergy or severe sensitivity to fish run the risk of serious or life-threatening allergic reaction if they consume these products. July 12, 2019: PROBAR LLC of Salt Lake City, Utah has initiated a voluntary recall of select flavors and lots of Meal® bars, including Chocolate Coconut, Peanut Butter Chocolate Chip, Original Trail Mix, Wholeberry Blast, and Superfood Slam due to the possible presence of undeclared milk and soy allergens. People who have an allergy or severe sensitivity to milk or soy may run the risk of a serious or life threatening allergic reaction if they consume the affected products. No other PROBAR® products are affected. Additional information is available here.

July 11, 2019: Crab House Trading Corp., a Los Angeles, California establishment, is recalling approximately 49,000 pounds of frozen Siluriformes products, specifically yellow walking fish, that were produced without the benefit of federal inspection. Additional information is available here.

July 10, 2019: Flowers Foods, Inc. (NYSE: FLO) is voluntarily recalling hamburger and hot dog buns and other bakery products due to the potential presence of small pieces of hard plastic that may have been introduced during production. Consumption of product may cause a choking hazard. The products being recalled were distributed to retail customers under a variety of brand names and distributed in AL, AK, FL, GA, IL, IN, KS, KY, LA, MO, MS, NC, OH, SC, TN, TX, VA, and WV. **July 8, 2019:** The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), along with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and state and local partners, are investigating a multistate outbreak of Salmonella Uganda illnesses likely linked to whole, fresh papayas. Consumers in all states should not eat any Cavi brand whole, fresh papayas and should throw them away. If consumers are unable to determine the brand of papayas, they should be thrown away. Retailers, restaurants, and other food service providers in all states should not serve or sell whole, fresh papayas under the Cavi brand, which is distributed by Agroson's LLC. July 8, 2019: Pet Supplies Plus is recalling bulk pig ear product supplied to all locations by several different vendors due to the potential of Salmonella contamination. Salmonella can affect animals eating the products and there is risk to humans from handling contaminated pet products, especially if they have not thoroughly washed their hands after having contact with the products or any surfaces exposed to these products. Bulk pig ears were distributed to Pet Supplies Plus stores in AL, AR, CA, CO, CT, DE, FL, GA, IA, IL, IN, KS, KY, MA, MD, MI, MN, MO, NC, NE, NH, NJ, NY, OH, OK, PA, RI, SC, TN, TX, VA, WI, and WV. Bulk pig ears were stocked in open bins. Prepackaged branded pig ears are not included in this voluntary recall. To date, 45 individuals in 13 states have been diagnosed with Salmonella related illness. Additional information is available here.

July 3, 2019: Growers Express is issuing a voluntary recall of select fresh vegetable products in an abundance of caution and in the interest of protecting its customers and end consumers. The fresh vegetable products include packaged varieties of butternut squash, cauliflower, zucchini, and a butternut squashed based veggie bowl. Additional information is available here.
