The scholarships include a \$5,000 Edwin B. Hogan Memorial Scholarship and two \$2,500 Ohio Minority Engineering Student Scholarships. The Edwin B. Hogan Memorial Scholarship, presented to a student of Black/African descent in the civil engineering, architecture, surveying, or planning fields with a focus on community involvement, was awarded to Anthony Young. Anthony is a senior at the University of Mount Union (Mount Union), and he is a defensive lineman for the Mount Union football team. He is majoring in civil engineering, has a minor in mathematics, and is pursuing a minor in African studies. Anthony balances academics, community service, and football while preparing for the Fundamentals of Engineering exam. Upon graduation, Anthony demonstrates an interest in giving back to his hometown of Alliance, OH. Throughout college, he has actively volunteered with the local parks in Alliance, the Alliance Community Pantry, and is currently a math tutor for middle school students through the Alliance City Navigators Program. Anthony’s engineering experience

includes an on-site internship with the Ohio Department of Transportation. Currently, Anthony is interning with Beaver Excavating Company in Canton, OH.

Ali Latimer and Luke Lasekan were awarded the Ohio Minority Engineering Student Scholarship, which is also sponsored by the Ohio Legislative Black Caucus and the National Society of Black Engineers.

Ali is majoring in construction management and hopes to someday open her own business of flipping affordable homes for her community. She is a first-generation college student projected to graduate this fall, and she has spent her college career working 50 hours a week while attending school full time. Ali volunteers with the City of Akron and is currently interning with G. Stephens, Inc. Her father and step-mom opened a nonprofit called Steppingstone LLC, and they counsel individuals with mental health issues. Ali would like to intertwine her father's nonprofit with her passion for construction management to improve the community.

Luke is second-year student at the University of Cincinnati and is an honors scholar studying architectural engineering. He participates in the National Honors Society for Black Engineers and Engineers Without Borders. Upon graduation, Luke would like to work closely with community leaders on community plans. He wants to give back to low-income communities and potentially work in Africa. Luke's engineering experience includes a co-op with Dugan & Meyer LLC, and he spends his free time volunteering at the Worthington Food Pantry.
