Giving back to his community, state, and country for more than 50 years, Les is committed to public service. He served as a member of the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners, representing the 3rd District from November 2010 to November 2020, and served as the Chairman for three terms, striving to foster a better place for all citizens to live, work, and play.

In his previous elected roles, Les achieved the following:

- Represented Hillsborough, Manatee, and Pinellas counties as a member of the Florida Senate's 18th District from 2000 to 2006. During his tenure in the Senate, he served in various capacities, including Democratic Leader (Minority Leader), Democratic Leader Pro Tempore, and Democratic Whip. He served as Vice Chair of the Ways and Means Committee, where he was the co-author of the state's \$70 billion and \$73 billion budgets during the two-year term
- Served in the Florida House of Representatives. He was Democratic Leader (Minority Leader) from 1998 to 2000 and is the first person in the State of Florida's history to serve as Democratic Leader in both chambers of the Florida Legislature. There, he established a reputation for bipartisan, innovative compromise and cooperation to improve Floridians' lives, especially in the areas of education, services
